A couple of weeks ago we looked at the various metaphors found within Scripture to describe the church. We did this to help us gain a greater appreciation of the church. We cannot rightly appreciate all that God has done for us if we do not have an appreciation for the church.

Today, we continue to look at the church and the blessing that it is in our lives. This time we turn to the book of Hebrews to find some words of exhortation and encouragement.
